Each tenured member (one year) that becomes the subject of a dismissal action may, upon final resolution with no disciplinary action taken, can apply to the board of trustees for a reimbursement of up to \$500.00 towards legal fees.

VCJTC Representation:

Because training plays such an important role, the VPA maintains a position on the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council so that we may have a voice in the professional development of our police officers.

Scholarships:

Raymond R. Mooney:

A \$1,000.00 scholarship is granted annually to a worthy Vermont high school student, who is pursuing a college degree at a Vermont college. Apply thru VSAC.

Erwin Bugbee Memorial:

A \$1,000.00 scholarship is granted annually to a worthy Vermont high school student, who has been accepted in a college level police program. Apply thru VSAC.

Herbert Fullam:

A \$1,000.00 scholarship is granted annually to a worthy child of a police officer (who is a member of the VPA in good standing) and is pursuing a college degree. Apply thru VSAC.

Gene Gaiotti Memorial Scholarship:

A \$1,000.00 scholarship is granted annually to a worthy member of the VPA (who is in good standing) or the child of a member and is pursuing a college degree. Apply thru VSAC.

Hank Havercoch Memorial:

Monetary awards are granted to VPA members (who are in good standing) for a financial assistance towards a community youth athletic program that they are involved with. Apply to the VPA Board directly.

Presidents Continuing Education:

Up to 5 qualified VPA members (who are in good standing) that are full-time employees of their agency will be granted monetary reimbursement for a college level coursework. Applicants must state an identified goal for the request, and have a financial need and have successfully completed the coursework. If the qualified applicants exceed 5, the selection shall be by a lottery. Apply to the VPA Board directly.
